From the Chairman's Desk

Of all the Foundation does and tries to do to make our River better, our Riverkeepers Program is, year after year, at the heart of our efforts. The Riverkeepers are our guardian angels.

When a storm blows a tree down blocking passage, they find it, assess it and like magic it is gone. When there our violations of the Natural Rivers Act, like the clear cutting of trees along the River, they spot it or hear of it and make certain the proper authorities are informed. When beavers get busy cutting down trees along the River that provide shade to keep the River cooler, they coordinate the removal. The Riverkeepers are also a key part of our effort to keep in check the invasive purple loosestrife.

These volunteers do all this and so much more, patrolling our River as our eyes looking for problems, making certain our River remains safe and beautiful for all of us to enjoy. And they take reports from anyone who sees similar issues that can adversely affect our River. For as long as I have known about this program, Eric Bankhead has been the Lead. All issues ultimately come to him to double check and then coordinate the "fix". Eric's work and that of his Riverkeeper team goes largely unnoticed because the "fixes" just seem to happen. These efforts are, however, the most important work the Foundation does day in and day out all year long.

My thanks, our thanks, to each and every one of them for their selfless efforts for us and the River we all love.

The River: Challenging Past, Bright Future



The North Branch has had its share of challenges over the last few years. The DNR had been reporting a decrease in trout populations since the 1990s; fishing guides reported a dramatic decrease in trout caught and observed in spring 2018; there have been high water flows, followed by low water flows, and even some surges of high water. While no one can control the weather, a large number of dedicated individuals and groups have been working tirelessly to improve things.

ASNBAF has partnered with Anglers of the Au Sable (AOTA), Mason Griffith Founders Chapter of TU, Lovells Township and Grand Valley State University by providing funds and volunteers for a number of projects.

Primarily through AOTA, trout structures and other trout habitat are being improved throughout the North Branch. Initial reports from areas where the work has been completed state that more fish are being caught and observed. According to Michigan DNR, the correct and effective placement of woody debris and structures will provide a place for young trout to hide and improve the function of the stream. This includes helping to move sand and sediment that covers the gravel necessary for effective spawning and for insect habitat.

USGS has installed one monitoring station for flow and temperature at Kellogg Bridge. So, if one monitor is good, more will be better. We are partnering with Mason Griffith and Lake Superior State University to install more monitors on the North Branch. These monitors will provide useful data for identifying issues and determining future projects.

Another source of important data will be the studies by Grand Valley State. Professor Mark Luttenton and his students are finishing reports on insect biomass and the survival rates of juvenile trout. Both of these will help us better understand the river and what we can do to help improve it.

As information and reports become available, we will be sharing it with you in our newsletters and on our web site, so stay tuned, and stay involved. We are confident that time on the river will continue to get better.


